

The following are the minimum criteria for eligibility as an ATP.

Each application is considered on a case by case basis and subject to final approval by the Scheme Manager.

There are 2 sections to the requirements: Training ability/experience and Technical competency/experience.

The requirements for each of the courses are as follows:

HACCP	As Above	<p>Passed an Advanced HACCP Course <b>and</b></p> <p>A minimum of 5 years experience in the Food Industry, in an appropriate role, with significant, demonstrable HACCP involvement.</p>

- An ATP will be registered for the lifetime of the Standard (typically 3 years).
- At the introduction of a new version of the standard, all ATPs must attend an updated BRC Train the Trainer Course.
- The ATP must also provide a log to demonstrate their Continuing Professional Development.
